

Classroom Hanger-Art In Action

The job of classroom hanger includes...

- + Each classroom has a classroom hanger. Their job is to check the class AIA schedule and, after a project is finished, hang it in the classroom.
- +Talk to the teacher and see where they want you to hang the art and when is a good time.
- + Get the art work from your class box in the right hand closet in the upper hall. Return all work to this box as well.
- +Hang with Tac 'N Stick Reusable Adhesive. You can get this at Home Depot or Michael's. File a refund from the office for this. Some classrooms have clothes pins and wires and some projects have nails already up for certain projects. (i.e. Grade two clay masks)
- + Some classrooms have many projects hanging some just like the latest one.
- +Hang the art with a sign saying who the artist was.
- + Check the library schedule and the main bulletin board schedule so you don't have the artwork needed for this in the classroom. Fran has copies of these in the AIA binder at the office. If artwork is scheduled to go to another board be sure it is in the classroom box for someone else to pick up.
- +The classroom hanger also helps hang the art for the art show. Your lead docent will let you know what this is. It is in the Spring.
- +If there are any problem let your lead docent know and she will see what she can do.
