SHARE THE HOPE

The readings for today's celebration of the Ascension of the Lord once again remind us that as Christians we are people of hope. In the second reading Saint Paul eloquently exhorts the Ephesians to enlighten their hearts so that they will know the hope and glory that come from being people who place their trust in the Lord Jesus. In the story of the Ascension, recounted in the first reading, the Lord Jesus assures the disciples that the Holy Spirit's power will come upon them. Finally, in the Gospel, the Lord lets the disciples know that their mission is to spread the hope of the Gospel to all the nations. This wonderful feast keeps our eyes focused on the hope in which we were grounded on the day of our Baptism.

(The Rite of Ordination of a Deacon)*

Last weekend the San Francisco Archdiocese celebrated the ordination of 13 new deacons. We welcome all the new deacons to their new service with our prayers and congratulations.

Deacon Ernie witnessed the ordination and expressed his joy for the incoming deacons, especially for our neighbor at St. Gregory's, newly ordained Deacon Sal Campagna. Sal often attended our 6:30am services and he has already touched many lives in our parish. Regarding his ministry here at St. Charles, Deacon Ernie expressed his sincere appreciation for all the support that you, the parish, give him adding, "No matter how we are called, we need each other to accomplish what Lord gives us."

The deacon is called to a three-fold ministry of the Word, Liturgy and Charity. Deacons are ordained to proclaim the Gospel and preach the Word of God. As an ordained participant in the Church's ministry of liturgy, the deacon confirms his identity as servant of the Body of Christ. As an ordained participant in the Church's ministry of charity and justice, the deacon assumes the duties entrusted to him by his bishop with humility and enthusiasm. At the core of his spirituality, a deacon puts on Christ and is guided by the love of Christ in caring for all in his charge.

But, away from his service at the altar, the deacon is not easily identified. He may be serving at a hospital, a prison or a homeless shelter. In these venues, the deacons are not attired in any specific garments. And the deacon blends in with others who are serving those in need. Some deacons teach in their parishes; many are involved in RCIA, Marriage Preparation, or Baptismal classes. Other deacons lead Bible study or ongoing faith formation classes. You may see deacons leading funeral vigils or committals for deceased members of your parish. Deacons may also baptize infants and young children, and they may witness sacramental marriages.

Wherever he may be, the deacon is a sign of service to the people of God.


DINNERS NEEDED: CAN YOU HELP?


